
Moorlands- A healthy school!

- Every class has access to cold filtered water and the school will provide a Moorlands water bottle, which needs to come back to school each day.
- We provide fruit for the morning break while they are in YR, Y1 and Y2.
- We provide milk in the afternoon
- We also encourage healthy lunchboxes.

School Dinners

- 3 week rolling menu with meat and vegetarian options each day. There is also a jacket potato option and a school packed lunch option which includes a roll with a filling.
- Seasonal changes to the menu each term
- All Reception, Y1 and Y2 children are entitled to Free School Dinners every day.



Breakfast Club



- We are currently trialling a Breakfast Club at Moorlands to help parents with child care before school.
- This will be running for the Autumn Term up until the Christmas holidays; and will then continue on after Christmas if successful with enough demand.
- The cost is £3.75 per session (non-refundable) and includes 'Magic Breakfast' (bagels, toast & spreads, and cereal).
- Breakfast club runs from 7:45am 8:45am
- Bookable/payable in advance via SCOPAY which you will be given a login for in September.
- You can use your tax free childcare account to pay but you will need to contact the office first as you will need to be registered on the system.

Support your child with any games or activities that they bring home. It really does show when parents support their child's learning outside of school.


Sing number and letter songs and play lots of speaking and listening games- I spy and counting items in the shopping basket are educational and fun! Visit your local library.





### **Arrangements**


- Every Early Years setting (pre-schools and childminders) is contacted to gain information about every child who is coming to us in September. We will be visiting children in their settings wherever possible.
- If your child has a special educational need then their current Early Years setting will be arranging for us to meet and you will be invited to join this meeting. Please let us know if you think this may be necessary for your child.
- A Social Story will be given out at the last school transition session along with a
  date for your home visit.
- There are sometimes play dates set up at facilities outside of school, during the summer holidays; to help children with making new friends and parents getting to know each other before the children start school. In the past Jumpin' Jax has set dates for this. Please keep a look out for these, they may be shared on their facebook page, if we are made aware of any playdates set up for Moorlands we will notify you with the details. This is not something organised by school.

### **Transition Project**

Early Years settings have been asked if they would like to take part in a transition project to help the children's transition into school.

This is a topic which will be started at their current Early Years Setting and continued at school.

Activities that they have carried out in their Early Years setting will be built upon in school using the same book. This will give children a sense of familiarity in school.



Children will find out more about themselves and their families, and they will think about other families and friends who are similar or different to their own. You may wish to share this book at home too, before your child starts school to aid transition.

# Southampton Library Service

- Attending your local library is a great way to help prepare your children for school and keeping them engaged in reading stories.
- The local libraries are no longer a place where children need to be quiet and offer a fun, play based space to enjoy books, play with your children and run rhyme time sessions.
- There are no fines on children's books.
- They have also stocked extra copies of the books we are using in our transition project so you can borrow these books to help support your children and get them ready for school.

# Family Hub

- Family Hub are also running sessions over the summer holidays to help support play with the children and will also help aid the transition project.
- These sessions are open to everyone and siblings can attend too.
- We will be sending out more information regarding these soon!

## **Home Visits**

- Home Visits are an opportunity for you and your child to meet with the class teacher and TA in your home setting, where your child is most familiar and settled.
- Tomorrow a form will be emailed to you where you wil be able to indicate the days that you are available – please tick as many as possible will help us schedule visits. We will try our very best to accommodate this. If someone doesn't fill this in we will give you an appointment at an available time.
- At the visit we will be asking the children to create an 'All About Me' bag, which they can then bring into school and share with their peers to help the children get to know one another.
