I observed the bones carefully and used the identification to help me find which animal the bones belonged to.

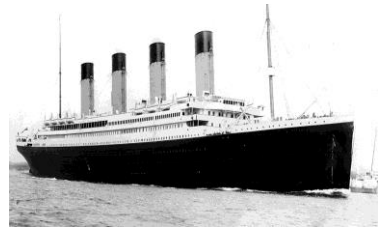


We learnt all about an owl’s diet by dissecting the pellets
