Autumn Term

Welcome to Year 2! At Moorlands we strongly believe in the partnership between school and parents in each child's learning. Each half term we will send home a curriculum newsletter outlining the work your children will be covering in that term. We hope this will help you to support your child at home.

MAIN TOPICS

The following topics have a main curricular emphasis, but also include other areas of the National Curriculum.

Autumn 2

Dungeons and Dragons

This term, our topic is "Dungeons and Dragons". During this topic, the children will work as historians to find out what it was like to live in a castle. We will be looking at a range of historical resources and use them to ask questions. We will develop a sense of 'chronology' to understand that things have happened in the past. We will also work as geographers to find out where castles were located and why by using maps and identifying human and physical features. We will be visiting Porchester castle and having a 'Medieval Life' in school!

English- Traditional Tales, Fairy Tales and Dragons - Autumn Term

This term the children will be learning about Grammar, Punctuation, Spelling, Comprehension and Composition through **stories and information texts**. We will be looking at a variety of stories about dragons and using them as inspiration for our writing! We will be looking at using adjectives and punctuation, whilst working on improving our spelling! We will continue to have daily phonics/ spelling lessons daily. We will then be looking at fairy tales and writing our own stories.



The children will receive weekly **homework** to practise spellings and weekly reading. Each day they will bring home their **book-bags** with a book to read - at a level they should be able to read mostly independently. Please fill in the **Reading Diary** to help us to hear how the reading is progressing at home. We will take in the diaries on **Thursdays** to respond to you and give back on Fridays. Children can earn Reading Rocket rewards when they read regularly each week!

Maths- Autumn Term

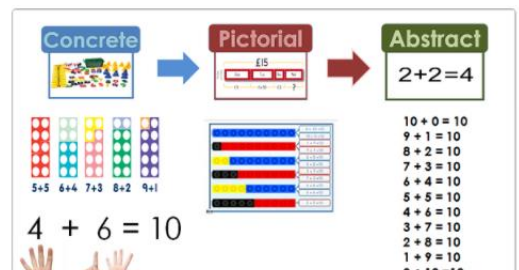
This term we will be focusing on Number, Place Value, Addition and Subtraction and Measurement: Money.

We use a very practical approach to maths where we strengthen the links between concrete, pictorial and abstract concepts.



Science

This term, we will be looking at living things including humans. We will be learning how to work as a scientist by looking at things closely and making observations.



RE

In Autumn 1, children will be learning about the concept of 'Wisdom'. They will learn that Ganesh is a Hindu God, and that he represents wisdom. They will learn that Hindus worship several different Gods and that they worship them at a Shrine. They respond to Hindu religious ideas in a variety of ways.

In Autumn 2 children will be learning about the concept of 'Identify' by learning about Christianity and the life of Jesus.



P.E

This term, children will be learning and practicing the skills of throwing and catching.

Please have their P.E. kit in school all week, including **outside P.E kits** (tracksuit top/sweatshirt and jogging bottom and trainers/ plimsolls). Please ensure they are **clearly** named. Please also ensure that long hair is tied back. Earrings **MUST** be removed on PE days or tape provided to cover them. Please remember that for health and safety reasons, children should only wear stud earrings to school.

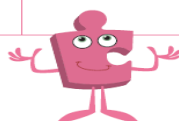

- use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies.
